

WHAT IS CCR?

A **COMPREHENSIVE REFORM** effort to make sure that **YOUTH** in foster care have their day to day **PHYSICAL, MENTAL,** and **EMOTIONAL** needs met; that they have the greatest **CHANCE** to grow up in **PERMANENT** and **SUPPORTIVE** homes and so they can have the **OPPORTUNITY TO GROW** into **SELF-SUFFICIENT** and **SUCCESSFUL ADULTS**.

HISTORY OF KATIE A

Katie A Lawsuit filed in 2002 against LA County, CDSS, and DHSS. The Plaintiffs: 5 Youth in Foster Care who experienced multiple placements and hospitalizations. Katie A is now known as Pathways to Wellbeing PTWB).

The Outcome:

Improved coordination of resources and services across delivery systems, uniformity statewide of Mental Health and other service providers.
